



Kindergarten News

What a bittersweet month we have ahead of us as we start the big transition from Kindergarten to Grade 1! While we have a lot of fun days planned, but, there is still a lot of learning left to do!

Here's a quick glance at what we have been learning:

- Students have taken to being the teacher/"coach" for each other as we have begun using a new resource to help us review alphabet sounds, sight words, and sounding out words. Take a peak in their red folders for the occasional example of this and have them show you how they coach one another.
- We have started reading short, repetitive and easy stories 1 on 1 with Mrs. Becker during center times.
- Students have been exploring numbers 11-20, and thinking about how they're split into tens and ones.
- In writing, we have been working on writing sentences more independently. We count the words in the sentence, draw a line for each word, and then put the sounds we hear in each word on the line.
- In Science, we did a quick introduction to energy, discussing how and why humans and animals move.
- In PE, we have continued taking advantage of the nice weather and have been doing alot of outside activities—including frisbee and soccer.

Thank you's and other notes and reminders:

- Continue to check red folders for their homework. The picture sorts that I
 am sending are a great way to consolidate their learning!
- Some important dates to remember for June are:
 - June 6: Track & Field—the Kindergartens do not participate, but we will receive a hamburger for lunch that day (please still send lots of snacks!)
 - June 11: Walk the Fire Department and Lions Park
 - Wear good walking shoes and pack a picnic lunch, extra snacks, and lots of water!
 - June 20: Kindergarten Graduation
 - Feel free to send an extra outfit along that day—I will make time for students to change before the ceremony.
 - June 25: Swimming in the afternoon (and our last day of school!!)
 - If possible (and it's still easy for bathroom breaks), send students to school in their bathing suits and pack a change of clothes for after swimming.

Grade 1 News

Another month has flown by! We can't believe that we are almost at the end of another incredible school year. We started the month of May off by celebrating the special women in our lives. Our Division 1 students, along with the help of Mrs. Neufeld, put on a fantastic performance for our Mother's Day Tea. We are very grateful to Mrs.

The students and staff at DDS also participated in our annual Community Walk where we delivered flowers to neighbouring houses. It is a fun way to get out into the community and spread some cheer! Our grade one classes have been working on our last numeracy unit, Geometry and Measurement. We have been focusing on 2D and 3D shapes, congruent shapes, symmetry as well as comparing lengths and areas of objects. In Literacy, we have been reviewing all of the "secrets" (phonics rules) that we have learned throughout the year and editing sentences and paragraphs with proper punctuation and capitalization. We encourage you to continue reading with your child each night and throughout the summer holidays. You will be absolutely AMAZED at their reading abilities.

As we look into the final month of the school year, we are excited to participate in our school wide Track and Field Day on June 6. Please remember to send water bottles, hats and sunscreen. We will also be going to Nikka Yuko Japanese Gardens and Legacy Spray Park on Monday, June 17 for our Grade 1 field trip. The students will also need to bring their bathing suit, a towel, hat, sunscreen and a bagged lunch. And finally, we will enjoy the last couple of afternoons of school at the Picture Butte pool on June 24 and 25.

We are looking forward to finishing up our Grade 1 curriculums and celebrating all of our achievements over the course of our school year. All of the students in Grade 1 should be so proud of their accomplishments!

Math

Lastly, it is TIME to do our time unit; working on how to read a calendar.

Language Arts

We are finishing up our opinion writing and will be experimenting with writing some poetry. We will also be doing activities, crafts, and writing with some picture books. Our class is finishing the Boy Called Bat read aloud, about a boy with autism. His mother, a veterinarian, brings home a skunk kit to take care of until it can be released into the wild, but Bat wants to keep it!

Wellness

We have been playing soccer in the nice weather and gearing up for track and field day. In health, we learned about respectful rhino and have been doing activities to go along with respect.

Science/Social

We released our butterflies! We have finished learning all about living things. We will spend some time working on coding and typing skills on the computers. Students also printed, typed, and decorated their own Indigenous Land Acknowledgements, which are on display in our hallway. They did an awesome job!

I have really enjoyed our time together and will miss our class so, so much. I hope everyone has a great last month of the year, and an enjoyable summer.






















Grade 3 News

In Language Arts we are finishing the novel <u>Because of Winn Dixie</u>, focusing on the characters as well as the "story mountain" that we typically see in books. Next we will be exploring poetry with students reading poems as well as writing different types of poems. They will be working at incorporating figurative language into their written pieces as well. To celebrate the end of our poetry unit each student will share his / her favourite poem. In true "slam



poetry" fashion we will show our appreciation by snapping our fingers (instead of clapping) for our fellow poets!

Our last math units of the year are division and measurement. The new numeracy curriculum has a lot of outcomes to cover and I am extremely proud of how hard the grade 3s have worked. Overall, this class has been tenacious, never giving up and always keeping a positive attitude towards the math concepts they were learning! Way to go, grade 3s!

Our final unit in science is living systems and students will learn about how plants and animals interact with each other and within environments. In social studies we will learn about India as well as how we can be responsible global citizens in our world.



What's Happening in Grade 4

Wow, we are already into the last month of school. It is unbelievable how quickly this year has flown by. What a fantastic year it has been and it's hard to believe we are in the home stretch.

During the month of May, students worked on developing fictional narrative stories. Students worked on adding dialogue to their stories, writing in paragraph form, as well as developing their



setting and characters. It was a lot of fun for the students to share the stories they wrote with their classmates and to celebrate their hard work. June's focus will be on nonfiction writing.

In May, the grade 4s worked on Algebra and learned the order of operations. We also took a look at some Geometry and learned about angles prior to our picture frame building with Lethbridge College. June will be a month where we look at some of our shorter math units such as Statistics and Geometry

In Science, we are wrapping up the Plant Growth and Changes unit. Students have enjoyed germinating a bean seed in the classroom windows and have been watching them grow now that they are planted in soil.

In Social Studies we are also wrapping up our unit on Alberta: Celebrations and Challenges and are finishing our learning about Alberta after 1905. Students have learned about different cultures and diversity in Alberta, as well as tourism in our province.

As we prepare for our Track & Field Day, grade 4s have been learning how to do High Jump and are continuing to work on their long jump and ball throw.



Grade 5 June News

In June we will be completing our final writing unit of the year, poetry! Throughout the month of June students will be creating their own poetry anthologies, or collections. We will learn about different techniques for improving word choice, such as alliteration, figures of speech such as similes and metaphors, and many other strategies for creating imagery and strengthening voice. Students will also be able to choose a theme for their poems and we will integrate artwork when publishing our poems.

In reading, students will be finishing up their study of the synthesizing comprehension strategy which requires readers to put together all the pieces to make meaning. Often this involves determining the importance of different details or information, in order to get the gist of a text. Students will read several nonfiction articles to practice this skill. Synthesizing also relies on making connections to prior knowledge about topics.

As we round out the year, we'll be completing our study of statistics with a focus on understanding frequency, mode, and the use of stem & leaf plots. These are all new concepts that have been introduced through the new math curriculum and so have been a big jump for the students to master. We will also examine symmetry as it relates to geometry and work to transform 2D shapes through rotations and reflections.

Throughout our math classes students rely heavily on knowing both their +/- facts, as well as the multiples of numbers 1 - 12. The more fluent students are with their facts, the easier these problems are to solve. Any practice at home really makes a big difference for your child's success at school.




Grade 6 Newsflash

In Grade 6, it's been a fun filled month with our field trip to the Frank Slide Interpretive Centre, our Grade 6 Overnight Extravaganza, Hats off for Mental Health, making collages at the Art Workshop: Reimagined Portraits, our RCMP presentation on Digital Citizenship, making Wampum belts, practicing for track & field, taking a community walk, attending the play "Sister Act" in Nobleford, and the Lethbridge College STEM workshop. And June hasn't even started!! Save the date on June 21st. Our Grade 6 Farewell is at 12:45 pm on June 21st. Students will be writing two PATs this year: Social Studies on June 19th, and Science on June 20th.

In <u>Language Arts</u>, we are engaged in our research essays. This is another opportunity for students to research topics that they are passionate about, and organize their information into a 5-paragraph essay. We are focusing on clear thesis statements, strong topic sentences to introduce paragraphs, and thoughtful transitions between paragraphs. We are also taking a hard look at proper comma usage and transferring comma usage to our essay writing.

In <u>Mathematics</u>, we are in the thick of our Geometry unit and using formulas to find the area of triangles, parallelograms, and trapezoids. We are also learning about the unique properties of triangles, finding missing angles, and classifying triangles by angles: acute, obtuse and right; then classifying triangles by sides: equilateral, isosceles and scalene.



In <u>Social Studies</u>, our Democracy study has brought us to the historical Haudenosaunee society and their consensus-based form of government. We are understanding the power of clan mothers, chiefs, the wampum belt, the Grand Council and how the Great Law of Peace became the constitution used to maintain peace and cooperation among the Iroquois nations.

In our <u>Science</u> unit, Sky Science, we are researching moons in our solar system, and studying asteroids, meteors and current innovations in space science

including the space station, the Hubble Telescope, astronauts, space shuttles and what this branch of science holds for the future.
