Kindergarten Corner



As we wrap up another exciting month in our kindergarten class, I wanted to share some of the wonderful activities and learning experiences the kindergarten kiddos have engaged in! Our focus areas this month have included phonemic awareness & phonics, shapes, syllables, counting, wellness, and physical skills. Here's a closer look at what we've accomplished:

*Phonemic-Awareness & Phonics: This month, we delved into the sounds and letters C, D, L, and E. The kiddos practiced recognizing these letters and their sounds through fun activities, including songs and interactive games. We also explored words that begin with these letters, helping to strengthen their phonemic awareness. Make sure to check their agenda bag at the end of this month for their extra writing and coloring pages for these letters!

*Shapes: Our shape exploration continued with identifying and drawing basic shapes: rectangles, triangles, circles, and squares. The kinder crew learned to name these shapes, count their sides, and even create their own shape art! It was wonderful to see their creativity shine as they incorporated shapes into their projects. I have included a picture of the wall of hidden shapes that they worked really hard on with their Grade 6 buddies!

*Syllables: We introduced the concept of syllables through the catchy song "Bee Bee Bumblebee." The eager learners had a great time clapping out the syllables in their names and various words.

*Counting to 10: Our counting journey has been continuing. We practiced counting in a variety of contexts, from counting objects in our classroom to engaging in counting games and songs. We love Jack Hartman:) This foundational skill is so important as we continue to explore numbers in the coming months.

*Wellness: This month, we introduced the Worry Woos to help the kiddos identify and express their feelings. We discussed how having worries can make us feel upset and explored strategies to manage those feelings. The Kinders learned to recognize their worries and share them with a trusted adult, fostering emotional awareness and resilience.

*Gym Activities: In gym class, we focused on catching and tossing skills. Through various games, the kinders practiced these essential physical skills while also working on teamwork and cooperation. It was delightful to see them encourage one another and celebrate their progress.

Grade One Focus

October was filled with activities for Grade 1! To start off the month, we recognized Orange Shirt Day and got to watch some videos and read some books to help us understand this part of our history. Then we were so fortunate to have our Artist in Residence, Meghan Cooper, come in to teach us about printmaking. We created works of art that represent "Canada...Coast to Coast". It was so much fun to be able to learn how to make prints. We finally got to see the teachers get "pied" for all of our amazing efforts in our Terry Fox fundraising. Way to go Rylee, for pie-ing Mrs. Nish, not once, but TWICE! Mrs. Pittman hosted another incredible Scholastic Book Fair for us, and we had so much fun choosing new books to take home. A huge thank you to Mrs. Pittman for always helping cultivate a love of reading! Halloween is always a favourite time of year in Grade 1. The students were so proud of their costumes and bringing treats for their classmates. We have been staying busy continuing to learn more "Secret Stories" in Literacy, and we have moved onto our Patterns unit in Numeracy. In Social, we have wrapped up our unit on Geography and Mapping, and will be starting our unit on Community. In Science, we are continuing to work our way through our Scientific Methods unit. Starting on November 6th, we will have Miss Tracey Vossebelt joining us for 5 weeks as our PS1 student teacher. She came in on October 28th for her orientation and made an instant connection with the students. We look forward to having her with us. Mrs. Nish would like to thank all of the parents that were able to donate to our Harvest Gala Classroom Basket! Our basket sold for \$300! That is AMAZING! Well, here is to November which is quickly creeping up on us!













We have had a great start to the year and we are really enjoying getting to know the grade 2 and 3 students!

In language arts we are wrapping up our unit on reading genres. Students learned about a variety of genres under the heading of fiction as well as some nonfiction texts. We also continue to develop our "reading strategies toolbox" by practicing a variety of word solving strategies that students can use when reading independently. In writing we have been working through the writing process, to improve on our stories and elaborate with details, including story beginnings that grab our readers' attention and endings that tie our stories together. We are extremely proud of the hard work that students have put into their personal narratives! Currently, we are sharing our writing in class so we can celebrate everyone's growth!

In math we finished our place value unit and have started addition and subtraction. Students will explore different strategies to see what makes the most sense to them in terms of building number sense. It is always so interesting to see how we all think differently in math and sharing those strategies can really help some students to see other ways of connecting numbers. We are also working through the outcomes in our geometry unit and our next 'bonus math' unit will be time.

We recently finished our first science unit on scientific methods and have started learning about states of matter. We will have some opportunities in this unit to do experiments to compare solids, liquids and gases.

In social studies we are learning about Peru and how it is the same or different from our life in Canada. Students made passports to "travel" to the new country and we are enjoying learning about a different culture.

Time flies when you're having fun! We have had such an amazing time in our classroom and there is always so much to celebrate. Each day the students in our classroom show up to school ready to learn, always giving their best effort. I am so proud of each and every student in our room.

In Literacy, we have been working on proper sentence structure, different types of sentences and personal voice in our writing. We finished the month off with a descriptive writing activity where students had to try to sell their haunted houses they created during our art class.

During our Numeracy block we have been exploring a variety of addition and subtraction strategies and adding and subtracting numbers up to 10,000, including decimal numbers. All of the students should be proud of the strides they have made this month in math!

In Science, we are continuing to learn about Matter, more specifically Hazardous Materials. In the next week or so, your child will be going on a scavenger hunt around your home to find examples of hazardous materials.

In Social Studies, we have been learning about Alberta's location in regards to other provinces, the 6 natural regions in Alberta, and the National and Provincial Parks that are located in Alberta. We have been doing a lot of project based learning and exploring during this unit.

To wrap up the month of October, we participated in our Halloween celebrations. All of the students looked amazing in their costumes! We had a lot of fun participating in our school dance and Minute to Win It games. A big thank you to Mrs. Milne for organizing such a fun event! The Grade 4 class would also like to send heartfelt thank you to Mrs. Pittman for organizing and hosting our school Book Fair! She always does an amazing job!

Grade Five is Fantastic!

What a beautiful month October was, with only a couple of tough days to be outside for recess.

In Language Arts, our daily Teacher Read Novel "Resistance" by Jennifer A. Nielsen continues to thrill us with the fictional accounts of a young Jewish teenager living in Nazi-occupied Poland. Despite her ongoing trials and setbacks, she continues to try and make a difference in the lives of the oppressed every day. Our weekly focused "Word Work" time is an ongoing spiral of spelling, punctuation, morphology, and word types that progress throughout the school year. As a class, each student has shown a real improvement in reading comprehension. In Math, we moved confidently through addition and subtraction of two, three, and even four-digit numbers. We also successfully tackled multiplication and division of single, double, and triple-digit problems. Our weekly Math Games class reinforces the teacher-led lessons and basic skills. In Social Studies, we have finalized the major partnered research & presentation project of several ancient civilizations including artifacts, maps, images, and a clear timeline that places the student's chosen civilization with its spot on that line from BCE (Before Common Era) to CE (Common Era), our time.

In **Science**, we have worked our way through the vital systems within the human body. This has led us to a similar look into the living systems of simple organisms including plants.

Grade Six Spotlight

It's been a whirlwind month - lots of activities, and lots of wind! Grade 5 & 6 students participated in a triple ball tournament at RI Baker. We hosted a few assemblies. Teachers were pie-ed for the Terry Fox fundraising. We did printmaking with our Artist in Residence. Grade 6 students are becoming pros at morning announcements, and enjoying setting up for events such as the Harvest Gala. Students are learning about War and Remembrance this month.

In <u>Language Arts</u>, we are now writing suspenseful stories. The writing focus we are working on includes using a strong narrative voice, and very specific word choices in order to create an eerie mood. Using dialogue is another skill that we are learning in order to bring characters to life in this creative writing mini-unit. We have also started a storyboarding project that includes learning about various film shots: close-up, medium range, long range, extreme close-up, panning, and zoom outs/ins to create a storyboard that could be brought to film. Students are choosing a short story that we have studied this year and turning it into a progression of visually stunning story slides.

In <u>Mathematics</u>, we have launched into a study of decimals and are looking at the concept of base ten. Positive numbers are multiplied by tens to produce hundreds, thousands, tens of thousands, etc. Whereas when working with decimals, the base ten principle applies, only numbers as divided by increments of ten to produce tenths, hundredths, thousandths, etc. We'll be working on converting decimals to fractions and vice versa. We're also reviewing recently acquired skills such as working with: exponents, integers, multiplication, division with remainders (and decimals!), subtraction with regrouping across zeros, and prime factorization. Students are starting to embrace vertical spaces and collaborative problem solving.

In <u>Science</u>, we have started our Solar System unit, and we're using creative acronyms to learn the planets in order. We'll be looking at celestial bodies such as meteorites, asteroids, stars, planets and moons in the coming week.



We continue the year-long study of democracy in <u>Social Studies</u>. We have taken a close look at the Canadian Charter of Rights of Freedoms, and now students are starting a comic strip activity depicting a violation of a person's Rights and Freedoms.

A few reminders...

I've been sending home Math practice sheets. They are not homework, just extra practice. Have your kiddo show you what they can do:)

Reading at home really helps students to develop greater fluency and comprehension, and it's a calming and healthy habit.

October has flown by and we have had so much fun singing about fall themes...especially falling leaves and pumpkins!

In Kindergarten, we have continued to focus on finding our singing voice as well as the different types of speaking voices we use. We have also enjoyed exploring different ways to move depending on the unpitched percussion instrument sound we are hearing.

The Grade 1 class has continued to participate in our body warm-ups to help us learn Italian words to describe aspects of music such as "staccato" and "legato". We have also explored phrases and are learning about rests in music. Listening to selections of Carnival of the Animals by Camille Saint Saens has also allowed us to begin recognizing different instruments with high and low sounds.

In Grade 2/3, this group of enthusiastic singers has enjoyed a variety of singing games with actions and moving with scarves to focus on keeping or moving to the beat. We also had a lot of fun adding instrumental sound effects to the story "Run, Turkey Run". This group has been exploring Italian terms for changing tempos in music using a variety of songs or listening selections and are becoming very proficient at echo singing solfege patterns.

The Grade 4 class has had a lot of fun learning the partner/line song Alabama Gal. They have also been practicing writing 4 beat rhythm patterns on white boards. We recently began learning a Maori (New Zealand Aboriginal) stick game called Maku e that involves a partner stick pattern to accompany the singing.

The Grade 5 students are enjoying adding the Orff instruments to a variety of songs and have also been practicing different body percussion patterns.

In Grade 6 we have been focused on learning many different note values through a hula-hoop game and a "Basketballs to the Beat" activity - thankful for the beautiful October weather we enjoyed!

I hope you have all had an opportunity to hear your child sing or share something they have learned in music class. Please note, the DDS lunchtime Choir Club has again started every Thursday from 12:00 - 12:20 for Grade 1 - 6 students and we will be performing a special song for the Remembrance Day Assembly on Nov. 8th at PBHS!


