Kindergarten Corner

It is so crazy that we are almost done with the first Semester of Kindergarten! As we come to the end of November, we are excited to share the wonderful progress your kids have made in the classroom! This month has been filled with learning, exploration, and fun activities that have supported our growth in various areas. Here's a quick look at what we have been working on:

Language Arts:

We continued building strong foundations in literacy by focusing on the sounds and recognition of the letters **F**, **V**, **A**, and **K**. Kindergarten Kiddos have been practicing identifying these letters, their sounds, and how they appear in words, both in writing and in listening activities. We also have been working on our Writing Journals this month! With short entries that have helped introduce the kiddos to writing down experiences and feelings.

Mathematics Concepts:

This month, we introduced the concept of "less" and "more", helping students understand quantity and comparison. We also practiced counting along number routes, building fluency and confidence with numbers. We spent more time learning about shapes, not only recognizing them but also using them creatively. The kids had fun cutting snowflakes and building snowmen using different shapes like circles, triangles, and squares.

Science Exploration:

In science, we explored the inside of our giant pumpkin and snowflakes! Kinders got to use their five senses to investigate the difference between a small pumpkin and our giant one! The kiddos also used magnifying glasses to observe the unique and beautiful features of snowflakes, sparking curiosity and conversations about where snowflakes come from and how they form in nature.

Health and Safety:

We talked about important topics like safety and healthy eating. The students learned basic safety rules for school and home, specifically situations such as Fire Drills. We also have been practicing expressing how they feel, using words and emotions to communicate with each other. Another Worry Woo came to teach up about the feelings of frustration. We learned new strategies of what we should do when we are starting to feel frustrated, with school, friends and ourselves.

Social and Physical Development:

In the area of social development, we introduced new teamwork games that helped your kiddos understand cooperation, sharing, and working together with classmates. The games also focused on improving skills such as catching and tossing, all while having fun and building friendships. A huge hit with this group has been games such as Monster ball, Let it go tag and the Rainbow parachute!

November has been a wonderful month of growth, and we look forward to the continued development of your child's skills as we move into December. Please remember to look in the agenda bags for the extra practice in letter names and printing! Thank you for your continued support and involvement in your child's learning journey!




















Grade One Wisdom

In Science we finally finished our first unit on The Scientific Method. We are a stellar group of young scientists now!



GRADE 2/3 HAPPENINGS

Can you believe we're heading into December???

In Language Learning students continue to work in their guided reading groups, to practice reading strategies and become better readers each day! Some of our groups finished their books and will be doing various activities, such as projects related to their texts or researching on the Chromebooks to find more information to share with the class through Google Slides.

We are also currently working on writing paragraphs, complete with a topic sentence, supporting details and a concluding sentence. As always, we continue to focus on including capital letters and end punctuation where they are needed. In December we will be keeping a daily journal of the adventures of Ruby Reader, our mischievous Elf on a Shelf who visits DDS each year. (Hopefully she shows up in our library as we are all looking forward to her arrival!) Students will be writing in first person, adding details, trying some different sentence starters and including proper punctuation.

In Math we are working on adding and subtracting equations, both with and without regrouping. Students have been sharing their strategies for finding "friendly numbers" to make the process easier and more efficient, and it has been so interesting to hear how students think in math! We will also be estimating numbers as well as working on some problem solving in this unit. In the afternoons we have completed our geometry units and will be learning about measurement.

We completed our science unit on states of matter and are beginning a new unit called earth systems where students will learn about how changes have happened to our earth over long periods of time, what we can learn from studying the earth's layers and how we can be responsible stewards to help sustain our environment.

In Social Studies we are learning about Peru and we have been discussing the geography as well as the climate. Students are working on their own or in small groups to create a weather forecast for their chosen geographical region in Peru. We will video all of the forecasts and will have them available to watch when we meet for student-led conferences later in the school year.

Welcome to Miss Griffiths who is a University of Lethbridge student who is doing her PSI practicum in the grade 2/3 B class! We really enjoy having her in our room!

- -A huge thanks to all families who practice the weekly spelling words with their children. It really benefits the students to start developing those study skills.


















Our year is flying by! Our class has been showing up every day ready to learn and work hard. In Literacy, we have been learning about parts of speech, morphemes, and adding proper punctuation to our writing. We have also been focusing on paragraph structure and are starting to write fantastic paragraphs!

In Numeracy, we completed our adding and subtracting unit and have been introduced to factors and multiples. As a class, we are struggling with our multiplication so we have been working hard at mastering our times tables. We have been playing a fun game called 'Knock Out'. All the kids really enjoy playing this game! It would be very helpful if you also practiced with your child at home so that they know their multiplication facts!

During our Social Studies class, we have been learning about provincial and national parks in Alberta as well as natural resources, renewable and non-renewable energy. We will be moving onto Alberta's History of the Land. We will be wrapping up our Social Studies unit in two weeks.

Our Matter Unit Test will be Thursday, Dec. 5. Throughout our unit, we have explored methods of waste management, recyclable waste, the three R's, the recycling journey, waste management issues, and WHMIS symbols. We will be wrapping up our unit by creating a plan to reduce our waste consumption.

GRADE 5 FLASH


It's Great to be in Grade 5!


Well, despite how mild November started it certainly ended by reminding us that it is still most definitely a winter month. Despite winter's arrival it was great walking to the high school to enjoy a collective Remembrance Day ceremony there and at the Cenotaph.


We will remember them!

In Language Arts, we are nearing the end of our Teacher Read Novel "Resistance" by Jennifer A. Nielsen, and it is certainly a wonderful example of the rising action that takes place in such a novel. Our weekly focused "Word Work" time is an ongoing spiral of spelling, punctuation, morphology, and word types that progress throughout the school year. Most recently we have as a class focussed on synonyms. Each student is continuing to show solid improvement in not only reading comprehension but also in the choices made through creative writing. In Math, the class has demonstrated an aptitude for fractions with a common denominator in addition and subtraction problems. In addition, when mixed numbers were introduced they barely lost any momentum when it came time to add mixed numbers together or with a fraction. Our weekly Math Games period on Fridays continues to reinforce the current teacher-led lessons and basic skills. In Social Studies, we started exploring the social sciences by looking at the roles and activities of both Archeologists and Anthropologists. This has provided students with an opportunity to gain a greater understanding of not only civilizations, or groups of people but also the culture and their way of life. In Science, we have completed our study of simple organisms including plants, and their unique cellular structure and system of sustaining life. Our new focus in the curriculum has shifted to learning about the particle model of matter in relation to the physical properties of solids, liquids, and gases.



























Reading Buddies!





Winter is here, and our Christmas concert is coming up fast! Grade 6 students are working on their dramatic roles for the concert with Mrs. Neufeld, so memorizing lines, sorting out costumes and painting a backdrop are the tasks at hand. We are also focusing on Wellness and have taken up drinking herbal tea in class this month to combat the cold.



In <u>Language Arts</u>, we are fully immersed in our Drama Writing unit. The new ELAL (English Language Arts and Literature) curriculum emphasizes the study of comedic drama. Students are practicing Reader's Theatre: taking on roles, using their voices creatively, and creating gestures and movements to convey meaning. Students are also learning about elements and types of comedy such as absurdity, dry humour, slapstick humour, and the 'rule of three.' All students will write their own Reader's Theatre comedy skits, and then they will also write a skit collaboratively with classmates. In word work, we are focused on the study of prefixes and word etymology.

In <u>Mathematics</u>, we are wrapping up our decimal unit and students have been very successful at applying strategies to decimal operations:

- adding and subtracting decimals numbers by lining up in accordance with the decimal,
- multiplying by removing the decimals, noting the number of decimal places, and then applying the decimal places to the product,
- dividing decimals by converting the divisor to a whole number by moving the decimal to the
 right, and moving the dividend decimal to the right proportionally, then dividing as usual.

We have also taken up subitizing 100 frames and daily multiplication fact practice with the slogan - "If you can't memorize it - find a strategy!"

In **Science**, students have been awed by discussions about the vastness of the universe. Our galaxy alone has approximately 4 billion stars! We are looking at celestial bodies including asteroids, meteoroids, comets and dwarf planets, and discussing why Pluto was demoted to a dwarf planet.



We continue the year-long study of democracy in <u>Social Studies</u>. We are looking at the history of voting rights and suffrage movements in Canada, and we were shocked to learn that so many groups of people have been historically denied voting rights.

A few reminders...

- It's cold out there. Please send your kiddo to school with proper winter clothing. Many students are coming to school without boots, toques or mitts.
- It's also cool in the classroom, so a hoodie or sweater is a really good idea for indoor use.
